Dear Secretary-General,

I am pleased to confirm that **Vesselnet Integrated Services Limited** supports the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption. With this communication, we express our commitment to making the UN Global Compact and its principles part of the strategy, culture and day-to-day operations of our company, and to engaging in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals. **Vesselnet Integrated Services Limited** will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the UN Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (CoP) that describes our company's efforts to implement the Ten Principles. We support public accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on progress starting the calendar year after joining the UN Global Compact, and annually thereafter according to the UN Global Compact CoP policy. This includes:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is separate from our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- The completion of the online questionnaire of the Communication on Progress through which we will disclose our company's continuous efforts to integrate the Ten Principles into our business strategy, culture and daily operations, and contribute to United Nations goals, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals.

Vesselnet was delisted from the United Nations Global Compact due to non-responsiveness resulting from administrative challenges, specifically the failure to submit the required Communication on Progress (CoP) within the designated reporting cycle. This lapse did not arise from a withdrawal of our commitment to the UN Global Compact principles, but from internal capacity constraints and organisational restructuring during a period of operational challenges. We are fully committed to reinstatement and maintaining continuous compliance with the UN Global Compact going forward. To achieve this, the following corrective and preventive measures have been implemented: 1. Strengthened Governance and Accountability The CEO is designated as the UN Global Compact for overseeing CoP

preparation and submission and maintaining ongoing engagement with UNGC requirements. 2. Formalised Sustainability Reporting Framework Vesselnet has implemented an internal annual sustainability reporting schedule aligned with UN Global Compact CoP deadlines. Environmental, social, and governance (ESG) metrics have been integrated into internal reporting and performance monitoring processes. 3. Enhanced Internal Capacity and Awareness Internal environmental and social responsibility training has been enhanced to improve staff awareness of UNGC principles and reporting obligations. Sustainability responsibilities are now embedded throughout operations rather than handled as ad hoc activities. 4. Demonstrated Commitment to UNGC Principles Vesselnet continues to actively pursue initiatives aligned with the Ten Principles, particularly in the areas of environmental responsibility, climate risk awareness, and ethical business conduct. The processes for identifying, monitoring, and mitigating environmental and social risks have been formally integrated into Vesselnet's operational procedures. 5. Continuous Improvement and Transparency Vesselnet commits to submitting CoP reports on time and openly sharing its sustainability progress with the public. Regular internal reviews will be carried out to ensure continued alignment with UN Global Compact expectations.
