Dear Secretary-General,

I am pleased to confirm that **ideanco** supports the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption. With this communication, we express our commitment to making the UN Global Compact and its principles part of the strategy, culture and day-to-day operations of our company, and to engaging in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals. **ideanco** will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the UN Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (CoP) that describes our company's efforts to implement the Ten Principles. We support public accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on progress starting the calendar year after joining the UN Global Compact, and annually thereafter according to the UN Global Compact CoP policy. This includes:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is separate from our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- The completion of the online questionnaire of the Communication on Progress through which we will disclose our company's continuous efforts to integrate the Ten Principles into our business strategy, culture and daily operations, and contribute to United Nations goals, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals.

Reason for Delisting: Force Majeure (Geopolitical Instability in Lebanon) The failure to submit the Communication on Progress (CoP) within the designated reporting window was directly caused by Force Majeure events—specifically, the severe escalation of the geopolitical conflict and instability in Lebanon, where Ideanco maintained critical operational ties and administrative archives during the reporting period. Corrective Actions & Pledge for Future Adherence Ideanco has now successfully stabilized its operations in Beirut and has severed its administrative dependency on the crisis-affected region. To ensure immediate and future adherence, we pledge the following: Immediate Submission: We have completed the 2025/2026 CoP and are ready to upload it immediately upon reinstatement. Resilient Governance: We have established a cloud-based

compliance framework that is independent of any single physical location, ensuring that future reporting cannot be disrupted by local instability. Executive Mandate: The CEO has assumed direct oversight of the UNGC relationship to guarantee that the Ten Principles remain central to our strategy as we rebuild and expand our operations. -
