Dear Secretary-General,

I am pleased to confirm that **PT. Trans Javagas Pipeline** supports the Ten Principles of the United Nations Global Compact on human rights, labour, environment and anti-corruption. With this communication, we express our commitment to making the UN Global Compact and its principles part of the strategy, culture and day-to-day operations of our company, and to engaging in collaborative projects which advance the broader development goals of the United Nations, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals. **PT. Trans Javagas Pipeline** will make a clear statement of this commitment to our stakeholders and the general public.

We recognize that a key requirement for participation in the UN Global Compact is the annual submission of a Communication on Progress (CoP) that describes our company's efforts to implement the Ten Principles. We support public accountability and transparency, and therefore commit to report on progress starting the calendar year after joining the UN Global Compact, and annually thereafter according to the UN Global Compact CoP policy. This includes:

- A statement signed by the chief executive expressing continued support for the UN Global Compact and renewing our ongoing commitment to the initiative and its principles. This is separate from our initial letter of commitment to join the UN Global Compact.
- The completion of the online questionnaire of the Communication on Progress through which we will disclose our company's continuous efforts to integrate the Ten Principles into our business strategy, culture and daily operations, and contribute to United Nations goals, particularly the Sustainable Development Goals.

Our organization was delisted during a period of significant internal transition. At the time, PT Trans Javagas Pipeline was in the process of winding down its field operations and undertaking a broader business transition toward a new business direction. This situation required substantial organizational restructuring and management attention. As a result, during the Communication on Progress (CoP) submission period, our primary focus was directed toward managing this transition process, which affected our ability to complete and submit the CoP on time. However, the delisting did not reflect a withdrawal of our commitment to the principles of responsible business. Throughout this transition period, we have continued to uphold and promote initiatives aligned with the Ten Principles of the

UN Global Compact and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), within the scope of our organizational capacity and ongoing activities. As we move into our new phase of business, we remain committed to strengthening our sustainability governance and ensuring that our future operations continue to align with the values of the UN Global Compact. We respectfully seek reinstatement because we see our participation in the UN Global Compact as an important framework for guiding our corporate responsibility journey, reinforcing accountability, and supporting our renewed commitment to responsible and sustainable business practices. Our organization pledges to re-establish internal coordination and oversight to ensure timely compliance with future CoP requirements, while continuing to integrate the Ten Principles and SDG-related considerations into our business transition and future operations.
